

For parents to set up their own plastic egg mystery hunt:

Materials:

- Plastic eggs (however many you'd like for the mystery hunt)
- Printable suggested clues for hunt
- Prize such as candy or little gift for your girl at the end of the hunt

Here are directions for you to set up their own mystery egg hunt for their Girl Scout Daisies.

1. Print out the clues worksheet I provided on next page (Or write your own clues on computer paper)
2. Cut out the clues and fold them up to put them in the plastic eggs
3. Hide the eggs in the appropriate places of the house. (Ex. You can give your girl the first egg with the first clue that says "Look for it where you get something to eat" and have the next egg with the next clue be in the refrigerator or the cabinet and so on)
4. Have a small prize/trinket waiting at the end of the hunt (The last clue you provide them with will lead to it)
5. To begin the hunt, either hand your girl the first plastic egg or a letter introducing the mystery and the first clue (ex. Welcome to this mystery hunt, if you would like a special treat you will need to find all of the eggs with clues around the house, the first clue is....")



Finding the first clue will be a treat! Look for it where you get something to eat.



Now that you're fed, go and look for the clue where you lay your head.



The next place you'll need to look, is the place where you can find a book.



Have you heard the news? The next clue can be found where we keep our shoes!



Don't tear the room apart! Just take a look in the stuff for art!



Look for the clues, but don't get stressed! You'll find another where you get dressed.



Looking for the missing link? Take a peek in the sink!



The next clue can be found on the box with a musical sound!



Wanting more? Why don't you check the front door?



Looking for the final prize? Go where you can look into your own eyes.
