Important Troop Meeting Update

Beginning November 1, GSSC troops may meet in-person, indoors with the following criteria:

- Any in-person troop meeting must follow NYS & CDC guidelines.
- All girls and volunteers must practice social distancing, wear face coverings (masks) and maintain 6 feet distancing of others and follow safety guidelines as outlined by NYS and the CDC.
- All girls and approved adults must have completed the registration or renewal process for the 2021 membership year.
- In addition: *Meeting Size* should include groups of no more than 26 people total, including adult coverage. Be sure to follow Safety & Activity Checkpoints to meet required Approved Adult to girl ratio.

Leading in-person activities during COVID-19 is optional. Volunteers should first decide if they are comfortable offering in-person indoor troop meetings before proceeding. Virtual troop meetings are encouraged. At this time GSSC prohibits indoor Girl Scout meetings in private homes.

Troops leaders reserve the right to put in motion pre-screening protocols that may include completing a pre-screening COVID form, taking temps, assigning contact tracers, etc.

Patch Programs:


Girls in Senior troop 1939 helped more than 20 Brownie and Junior Girl Scouts earn their Raise Your Hand patch to become bold and brave.
