



### Volunteer Experience

From new resources that help volunteers feel comfortable leading outdoor adventures to simplified documents, flexible virtual trainings, and regular monthly newsletters, we are making it easier than ever for volunteers to confidently guide and support Girl Scouts year round.

### Our 2nd Annual Troop Expo

offered a morning of meaningful connection as leaders and volunteers explored exhibits featuring hands-on training, tools, and resources, fostering stronger networks and shared ideas to elevate the Girl Scout experience in the year ahead.

The Community Program Initiative delivers the Girl Scout experience to underserved communities through staff-led, school-based programming. With more than 80% of participants requiring financial assistance for uniforms, badges, and membership fees, the initiative depends on support from council partners and sponsorships.

Grants from Girl Scouts of the USA, The M&T Bank Foundation, and The New York Community Trust helped bring our in-school programs to life by supporting facilitator costs. Thanks to these partners, more girls experienced the power of Girl Scouting—opening doors, expanding possibilities, and helping build a brighter, more equitable future for every girl.



# Programs & Badges

24,789 Total Badges Earned

Girl Scouts is where curiosity leads the way. Where every activity, every badge, every event, and experience connects to building a girl's lifelong strength and confidence. The Girl Scout Leadership Experience is centered on four pillars: STEM, Outdoors, Life Skills, and Entrepreneurship.

The Girl Scout Cookie Program and the Munchies & More Program teach essential entrepreneurial skills such as goal-setting, money management, and business ethics, helping girls build confidence and leadership.

In the fall, the Munchies & More program expanded its lineup with new products—including a candle line—joining favorites like BarkBox, magazines, and delicious treats from Trophy Nut Company.

When rising commodity costs led to an increase in cookie prices to \$7, Girl Scouts adapted with creative strategies such as enhanced digital marketing, in-person booth sales, and stand-a-bouts. Crossover rewards encouraged participation in both product programs. Higher troop proceeds helped fund meaningful activities and experiences for girls, and the top five cookie sellers were celebrated with a special trip to NYC for a Broadway show and lunch with our CEO.

The Girl Advisory Team, launched in Fall 2024, energized our program development by putting girls' voices at the center. Meeting monthly and working through dynamic subcommittees, members helped shape exciting experiences for Girl Scouts of every level.

They also played a standout role in planning our EmpowerHER event—a powerful day that brought together more than 200 Girl Scouts, families, and friends with women business leaders to spark inspiration, celebrate leadership, and show girls what is possible when women lift one another up.

# Connecting with Nature

This year, we expanded access to incredible outdoor experiences through updates to Camp Edey, a revitalized Counselor-in-Training (CIT) program, and the full return of Troop Camping.

**New Places to Come Together:** Creating new outdoor meeting spaces, with seating crafted from reclaimed trees on the property and hand-painted signage inspired by animals at Camp Edey, allowed for extended programming and enhanced the camper experience.

**Making Space for Outdoor Experiences Year-Round:** With more weeks added to the online camping calendar, troops can steadily build outdoor skills while creating shared experiences that strengthen friendships.

**New Leadership Opportunities for Teens:** Eliminating tuition costs and enhancing the application process enabled the Counselor in Training program to attract motivated participants ready to grow. With weekly mentoring and the added benefit of the Teen Venture trip, this program built skills and confidence, making it a powerful pathway for developing the next generation of camp leaders.


**Financial Aid:** Financial assistance grew in both reach and impact, with funded weeks increasing from 102 to 116 and total support rising from \$35,629 to \$37,619, opening the door for even more girls to experience the joy, discovery, and community that camp provides.



# Funding the Future


## Income
