
Girl Scout Vocabulary Crossword

Badges vs Fun Patches

What's the difference?

Girl Scout badges are earned by completing specific, skill-building requirements, while fun patches are for participating in events or activities without specific requirements.

Official Girl Scout badges are worn on the front of a GS uniform. Fun Patches are always on the back. Think of badges as official achievements and fun patches as souvenirs of experiences. And luckily, both are available at our Girl Scout Shop!
