Introduction

Girl Scouts of Suffolk County is fortunate to have more than 2,500 Adult Volunteers. These volunteers give themselves and their time to the Girl Scout Movement, and, in turn, reap the reward of helping girls become the strong, confident leaders of tomorrow. Their dedication emphasizes the qualities that Girl Scouts value. Volunteer Appreciation Awards in Girl Scouting acknowledges those volunteers who provide service above and beyond what is expected.

The criteria for these awards are established either by GSUSA or GSSC and focus on leadership, implementation of goals, acceptance of responsibility, and consistent follow-through.

This guidebook will provide information on award criteria, nomination and review process.

General Information

In addition to specific award criteria, nominated candidates must meet the following eligibility requirements to receive recognition:

- Registered Girl Scout
- Active member of Girl Scouts of Suffolk County
- Volunteer in good standing as defined by Council
- Nomination forms submitted by the deadline

Volunteer Appreciation & Awards Dinner

Council recognizes adult volunteers for outstanding service and commitment to the Girl Scout movement in Suffolk County at our annual dinner held in the Spring (April). Award recipients will be notified of their award and information about the event will appear on our website in early winter.

Service Unit Level Recognition

Service Units are encouraged to host local events to honor their volunteers in addition to attending the council dinner. Service Units may want to incorporate Girl Scout traditions and ceremonies as part of their celebration.

Nomination Process

Any active Girl Scout member, Girl Scout parent or caregiver, or alumna may nominate a volunteer for Volunteer Appreciation Awards. Each award has specific criteria for nominee eligibility and nominations must be received by deadline for consideration.

The criteria for these awards are established either by GSUSA or GSSC and focus on leadership, implementation of goals, acceptance of responsibility, and consistent follow-through.

Award Pins

Award pins will be available for Service Unit Teams to pick up at the annual dinner. This will include pins of those not attending the event for team members to distribute at a later date.

Writing Award Nominations

The focus of adult recognition awards is impact on girls and the Girl Scout movement. The Adult Recognition Committee, comprised of volunteers from throughout the Council, is serious about evaluating potential adult volunteers for the most prestigious awards a council may award to adult members. The committee relies on the completeness and accuracy of the nominations. Please let the time you take to fill out the nomination or endorsement be thoughtful as you let us know the outstanding characteristics of the person you are nominating.

This chart shows how a statement, with a little thought, can become a strong nomination statement for the Adult Recognition committee's review:

Initial Statement	Consider	Strong Nomination Statement
"She has been a leader for a long time."	How many years? Through which levels?	"For 11 years, she has led a large troop from Daisies, persevering through the difficult middle school years, to their current level of Seniors."
"She is a great leader."	What kind of leadership qualities does she bring? What makes her stand out?	"She continually brings leadership opportunities to the girls. She encourages a girl-led approach by allowing girls to vote on and implement their activities as well as makes sure they are knowledgeable about the mentoring programs such as LiA and CIT awards."
"She always goes above and beyond."	Be specific! Tell a story about the great benefits those around her receive due to her efforts.	"Her troop voted to start the aMuse Journey. Because she has never considered herself a "creative soul" when it came to artistic endeavors, she recruited troop parents, artists, and actors as resources for her girls to draw from. As a result, the girls have had a great time meeting community experts and discovering parent talent in their own troop! They now have several opportunities for Take Action projects because of these connections.
"He's a dad who helps whenever needed."	Be specific! Tell a story about the support given to the girls, and how the girls benefitted.	"This volunteer came to the rescue during a troop campout when the troops discovered a nest of baby raccoons in camp! He kept both the girls and leaders calm as he assisted in alerting the site director, all the while educating the girls about wild animals and safety. The girls felt safe, and in control, thanks to good guidance!"

Award recipients are selected by designated Girl Scouts of Suffolk County leadership that includes Board of Director members and the Volunteer Appreciation Awards Committee. Recipients will receive an email letting them know they have been selected for an award.

Service Unit Level Awards

Service Unit Team members nominate volunteers and leaders for Service Unit level awards. There are specific criteria for each award and recipients are considered and selected by Service Unit committee members. Some awards can be received by multiple volunteers.
